A Word from Whitney

Not just for fun in music: Intergenerational group music therapy

Every Friday morning, children (ages 4-5) from Fremont Street Nursery come and have music with us. Every participant looks forward to them coming and being the children's grand friends. During and after the music time, I see smiles on many of our participants. This is how I know this music session really means something to them, especially their psychosocial well-being. "Older adult participants perceived an increase in their feelings of usefulness towards the child participants..." (Belgrave, 2011, p.504). In addition, intergenerational music therapy group benefits both generations by improving cross-age interactions and cross-age attitudes. Belgrave (2011), in the section of cross-age interactions: "Children may have encouraged older adults during the moving to music activities or older adults may have assisted children with spelling... They often find joy in helping others" (p.502); in the cross-age attitudes section, which both generations' attitudes became more positive to each other while they worked together in the session (Belgrave, 2011). The most important elements in this intergenerational group are love, caring, and supporting each other.

Nurses Notes



Seasonal Allergies¹

Springtime is the typical start of seasonal allergy symptoms in Virginia. Symptoms may include itchy eyes (don't rub the eyes, as this will generate more histamine release and worsen symptoms), sneezing, runny/stuffy nose, sometimes cough, but not fever. The allergy symptoms are the result of the immune system reacting inappropriately to harmless materials by producing immunoglobulin E (IgE) antibodies. Pollen is often a culprit, and at its highest levels on hot, dry, windy days. A hard rain will wash down pollen for a short time, and then the levels may rise as plants respond to the rain. Stay indoors during mowing. Allergies may lead to sinusitis, or trigger an asthma attack. Consult your loved one's physician before giving over-the-counter antihistamine medication, as some are contradicted in the elderly. A cloth soaked in cold water and pressed gently on the eyes can provide some relief from itching.
