

How to Avoid Getting

Getting the flu vaccination is the best protection from the flu. Influenza is a respiratory infection that can cause serious complications, particularly to young children, older adults and people with certain medical conditions. Influenza vaccines (though not 100 percent effective) are the best way to prevent the misery of the flu and its complications. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that everyone 6 months of age or older be vaccinated annually. It takes up to two weeks after the injection to build immunity. Influenza viruses evolve, so last year's vaccine may not protect you from this year's viruses.

Other protections include: Washing your hands often and thoroughly with soap and water, using an alcoholbased sanitizer on your hands if soap and water aren't available, avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth whenever possible, avoiding crowds when the flu is most prevalent in your area, and practicing good health habits (i.e., getting plenty of sleep, exercising regularly, drinking plenty of fluids, eating a nutritious diet, and managing stress).
