#### <u>Nurse Notes</u>

### **Coronavirus**<sup>1</sup>

2019 Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) is a virus (more specifically, a coronavirus) identified as the cause of an outbreak of respiratory illness first detected in Wuhan China this month. Early on, many of the patients in the outbreak in Wuhan, China reportedly had some link to a large seafood and animal market, suggesting animal-toperson spread. However, a growing number of patients reportedly have not had exposure to animal markets, suggesting person-to-person spread is occurring. Patients with confirmed 2019-nCoV infection have reportedly had mild to severe respiratory illness with symptoms of fever, cough and shortness of breath.

CDC believes at this time that symptoms of 2019-nCoV may appear in as few as 2 days or as long as 14 days after exposure. This is based on what has been seen previously as the incubation period of Middle East Respiratory Virus, which is also a coronavirus. Coronaviruses are common in many different species of animals, including camels and bats. Rarely, these coronaviruses evolve and infect humans and then spread between humans.
